

## CompassSport Cup/Trophy Final 2018

## Abraham's Valley Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> October 2018

**Event Arena**: Haywood Park Farm, off the A518 near Stafford. Postcode ST17 0XA, Grid Reference SJ993208.

**Parking**: Farmer's field next to A518 road. Assembly Area is in the same location as the car park. The following car park charges are to apply: Cars £2, Minibuses £5. Parking arrangements and charges for coaches are TBC at this time but provision for this is being arranged.

**Courses**: Standard CSC Courses from 1 to 9B inclusive + yellow and white. String course available.

Start: 1000-1400 (timed start). Club allocated start times.

**Entry Fees**: Seniors £15, Juniors £8. Limited EOD available on White/ Yellow/ Orange/ Light Green Courses only.

**Punching:** (SI) Sport-Ident Electronic, no hire charge. Clubs are encouraged to lend their own SI cards to runners who require them as WCH has a limited supply of SI5 cards for hire. SIAC is currently planned to be enabled. Clubs will be advised if this changes.

**Terrain**: Abraham's Valley is fairly typical of Cannock Chase with varied terrain of forest, scattered trees and open land. The area is gently sloped and contains a fairly extensive path and track network.

**Traders**: Ultrasport will be available in the arena for all of your Orienteering retail needs. A number of catering vendors will also be available.

**Dogs**: Dogs are allowed on a lead.
